Our mission is dedicated to uniting women of all ages for community service, supporting charitable organizations, fostering friendships and empowering women through learning about the community around us. The Woman's Club of Fullerton resides in a city of 135,161 community members. Since our 2007 rebirth, we have grown to 60 members and growing.

Crittenton Services for Children and Families program The Angel Tree always makes the Woman's Club of Fullerton members eager to sign up to buy gifts for these children. We enjoy fulfilling each of the wishes each child chooses. Each is asked what they would like to have Santa bring them, and then members select the gifts. The Woman's Club of Fullerton members make these children's Christmas much brighter and merrier. The gifts are donated by each member that signs up to grant the wish for each of the children. The children range in ages from infants to late teens. Some of the gift requests are shoes, clothes dolls, toys and gift cards. One of the wishes was for a pink Fairy Princess Castle Tent!

The Woman's club of Fullerton collected donations from the members and approved \$500 to purchase laundry baskets with wheels for Crittenton's clients to take their laundry to the Laundromat. Members donated liquid laundry, hand, and dish soap. All purpose cleaner, Windex, kitchen and bathroom trash bags as well as paper towels and mops and brooms and personal hygiene items were included also. The club collected donations to complete 10 baskets and had many items left over to make more baskets. This was a very heartwarming project that will help so many of Crittenton's clients that are struggling during this Pandemic.		

Ten of the Woman's Club of Fullerton members joined the Fullerton Parks and Recreation for their OctoBOOfest in the downtown Fullerton Farmers Market. The market was set up for some spooky fun for the little ones. Each of the vendors had individual baggies of candy or toys that the children attending could pick

Project Title: Extraordinary Lives Foundation Hours 10 Donated \$ 2,000 In-Kind \$ 0

Four members of the Woman's Club of Fullerton and the Managers from Ocean Subaru of Fullerton had the pleasure of presenting to the Founder and CEO of Extraordinary Lives Foundation (ELF) and the Vice President and the Mascot "Piggie Bear" a check for \$2,000.

Project Title: Assistance League of Fullerton Hours 10 Donated \$ 3,700 In-Kind \$ 0

Members of the Woman's Club and the Assistance League of Fullerton and Manager from Ocean Subaru of Fullerton met the Principal of the Commonwealth Elementary School to present her school with 350 headsets for her pupil's distant learning curriculum. We were given a tour of the school and shown how temperatures are taken in the office of employees and children prior to going to their office or classroom each day. The children play in certain areas, always keeping social distance from other play groups. The Principal says it has been a challenge, however, they have figured it out. We are impressed how they gave adapted to the ever-changing lifestyle environment due to the Pandemic.

Everyone was very appreciative on receiving the headsets for their students. We were happy to be able to donate these headsets to the Commonwealth School and we look forward to finding more ways to contribute to the community in these difficult times.

Project Title: Priority Center Gifts Hours 15 Donated \$ 3,000 In-Kind \$ 0

Four members of the Woman's Club of Fullerton along with two Managers from Ocean Subaru of Fullerton presented to Priority Center Christmas gifts for three low income families. Each child from three families presented a list with 3 items. The Mothers and Fathers also got a wish list. Each of the parents received a \$100 gift card and the children each received the three items requested.
