Many uncounted hours of frustration and determination went into prevailing with our deposits in place and dates to be determined pending the COVID-19 pandemic outcome.

**Digital Day of Giving**

The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club (SCWJC) held our first online fundraiser on October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020 and was organized and managed by our Club President to ensure our club had a way to raise funds to float our budget for the rest of the year. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic our annual

fundraising gala known as The Big Event was cancelled just weeks before the event which was scheduled for March 28<sup>th</sup>. To ensure we did not lose our deposit on our online bidding platform, our president negotiated to allow us to use the platform at a later date. Unable to provide an in-person event, our president took the lead in organizing our Digital Day of Giving online fundraiser.

By transiting the event online, we were able to re-use many of the gift baskets we had already procured for the gala many which would have expired otherwise. Our president worked with the community businesses that had provided the donations to ensure that the donation was still appropriate to share out and repurposed only items that provided safe and convenient use during this time. Without her leadership, management, and encouragement we would have lost out on an opportunity to engage our community and collect donations to sustain not only our club but the many beneficiaries that rely on us each year. It is a relief to know we will be able to provide for our beneficiaries when they will most likely need it the most.

**Zoom meeting**

The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club (SCJWC) transitioned to an online digital meeting format out of necessity due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Rather than not meet at all, SCJWC was able to transition to Zoom meetings once a month starting in March 2020. This format allowed the Club to conduct business, keep in touch, and maintain the Club. Meetings usually lasted between 30 and 60 minutes. Agendas were provided before each meeting digitally. The host Zoom account was donated to the Club by a member and allowed meetings to last longer than the allotted 45 min maximum for free accounts. Although not a replacement for in-person meetings, the Zoom meeting format allowed the Club to continue its work in 2020 and proved beneficial.

The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club (SCJWC) decided to make changes to their bylaws to change its Club year from January-December to July-June. The bylaws were discussed, drafted, and voted on in 2020. Further, December board transitions have been historically difficult for Club members due to the busy time of year. Further, the Club's busy time has always been from February- June, making it extremely difficult for a new president and board to transition into their positions while also completing large events like their annual fundraising gala. We are hopeful that although 2020 was not an ideal year, one positive thing that came from it is that the Club has finally been able to make the transition to a Club year that will serve it better.
